
A Cowboy Action Shooting Competition Hosted By Eustis Gun Club March 15 – 17, 2013

IOM Stage 1 - Lucky Jake and Double Trouble

Starting

Position:

by barrel/table with rifle (hands on rails)

Starting Line:

"Better to be good than lucky"

ATB: With rifle engage the three rifle targets by double tapping the two bottom targets then single tap the top target, then repeat instructions make rifle safe, move to shotgun engage the four knockdowns till down make shotgun safe, move to between fence posts engage the three pistol targets by double tapping the two bottom targets then single tap top target ,repeat instructions with second pistol


IOM Stage 2 - Stan and Dan and the Still

Starting Line: "Dan you dance like you shoot"


ATB: With pistols engage the three targets for 10rds(the two hands & dump plate). Any misses after Both hands are off count as misses, hands left on are misses move to rifle engage the four targets with 10rds putting at least 1rd on each make rifle safe, move to shotgun engage the knockdowns any order

Position straight)

Starting Line:

"Are you kidding me"


ATB: With rifle engage the four rifle targets in a digressive sweep from either direction (ie: 1,2,3,4,1,2,3,1,2,1) move to table where shotgun is staged make rifle safe, with shotgun engage the two shotgun targets move to other table engage other two shotgun targets make shotgun safe, move to corral fence with pistols engage targets in a continuous Nevada sweep from either direction.

IOM Stage 4 - Looking for a fight?

Position Red's shoulders

Starting Line: Give OI Big Red a slap across the face

"You're starting to look like a Jack-O-Lantern"

ATB: Move to shotgun engage knockdowns any order make shotgun safe, move to rifle engage the plate rack (Any plates not down can be made up by reloading rifle) make rifle safe move to left window and engage the three pistol targets with at least 1rd each for 10rds.


IOM Stage 5 - The Desert Story




Staging: Pistols holstered, rifle in hand, shotgun on

right barrel/table


Starting Position: By wagon with rifle in hand

Round Count: 10 Pistol 10 rifle 6 + shotgun

Staging: Pistols holstered, rifle & shotgun on bar in saloon

Starting Pos: Bank window ,both hands on gold nugget

Starting Line: 'We're havin' one heck of a party tonight!"

ATB: With pistol(s) alternate on two left pistol targets for 5rds move to bank doorway put 5rds on right pistol target ,move to rifle in saloon and alternate on a outside target and center target for 5rds then put 5rds on other outside target make rifle safe with shotgun engage knockdowns till down

IOM Stage 6 - Looking for a party tonight Sponsored by



ATB: With rifle engage the rifle targets with 2rds each from either end then place 4rds on center target make rifle safe move to your pistols and engage targets by sweeping with 1rd each from either direction then placing 2rds on center target repeat instructions for 2nd pistol move to alley way and with shotgun engage knockdowns till down.

IOM Stage 8 - Win a \$50 Gold piece



Staging: Pistols holstered, rifle center table, shotgun port arms

Starting Pos: Behind left or right window ,shotgun cowboy port arms

Starting Line: "2 hits 4 hits 6 hits for a dollar"


ATB: Engage two knockdowns thru window move to other window and engage two knockdowns thru window move to center table engage last pair of knockdowns make shotgun safe with rifle engage the five rifle targets in a 2-1-4-1-2 sweep from either direction make rifle safe with 1st pistol engage the three pistol targets in a 2-1-2 sweep from one direction then with 2nd pistol from opposite direction.

IOM Story 9 - The Dublin Gang

Staging: Pistols holstered, rifle on right table, shotgun on

left barrel/table

Starting Pos: Texas surrender: hand(s) on gun(s)

Line: "They won't be needing a Mulligan after that shot"

ATB: With pistols engage center target with 3rds then each outside target with 1rd each repeat instructions 2nd pistol, move to rifle engage center target with 3rds then each inside target with 2rds then each outside target with 1rd each make rifle safe, move to shotgun engage knockdowns till down


Note: With rifle shooter does not have to cross over when going from inside to outside targets

Staging: Pistols holstered, shotgun on left barrel & rifle on

right table

Starting Pos: Holding shovel both hands

Starting Line: "Well Shamus, when does that rich part happen?"

ATB: With shotgun engage the four knockdowns till down make shotgun safe move to rifle with rifle engage the rifle targets in a Lawrence Welk (1rd,2rds,3rds,4rds) make rifle safe move past fence and engage pistol targets in a Lawrence Welk sweep by alternating on two pistol targets
